About our Honorees Rabbi Frederick Klein, B.C.C.

Rabbi Frederick 'Fred' Klein is Director of Mishkan Miami: The Jewish Connection for Spiritual Support, a program of the Greater Miami Jewish Federation and serves as Executive Vice President of the Rabbinical Association of Greater Miami. In this capacity he overseas Jewish pastoral care support for Miami's Jewish Community, trains volunteers in friendly visiting and *bikkur cholim*, consults with area synagogues in creating caring community, and organizes conferences on spirituality, illness and aging. As director of the interdenominational Rabbinical Association of Greater Miami, he provides local spiritual leadership with a voice in communal affairs. Rabbi Klein also is engaged in teaching Torah to Jews of all backgrounds. He serves as the in-house rabbi for the Jewish Federation of Miami.

Rabbi Klein is a Miami native and graduated magna cum laude from Brown University, where he received a bachelor's degree in religious studies. He studied in Israel under Rabbis Shlomo Riskin and Chaim Brovender. While in rabbinical school at Yeshiva University, he received an MA in Bible at Revel, and later earned an MPhil in Jewish history from Columbia University. During rabbinical school, Rabbi Klein was awarded the Wexner Graduate Fellowship, and has received numerous awards for his work with aging populations and community work.

He received Board Certification from the Neshama: The Association of Jewish Chaplains and has done clinical rotations at New York Hospital Medical Center of Queens, NY, Jackson Memorial Hospital and VITAS hospice. Rabbi Klein has taught at and been involved with the Pardes Institute of Jewish Studies, Drisha Institute for Jewish Education, Hebrew College of Boston, the Florence Melton Adult Mini-School, CLAL—The National Jewish Center for Learning and Leadership, and the Shalom Hartman Institute. He is Vice President for the Rabbinic Cabinet of the Jewish Federations of North America, former Chair of the Interfaith Clergy Dialogue of the Miami Coalition of Christians and Jews, and former board member of Neshama: The Association of Jewish Chaplains.

He biggest pride and blessing is his four children, Moshe, Sara Shulamit, Binyamin and Aryeh.

About our Honorees Mr. James Cohen

James A. Cohen joined the Minneapolis Jewish Federation as CEO in 2017, bringing with him a broad background of service to both our country and the Jewish people.

Before Minneapolis, Jim served as CEO of the United Jewish Federation of Greater Stamford, New Canaan, and Darien. During his tenure there, Jim brought substantive positive change to the organization, including implementing new modalities of giving, establishing a legacy society, updating the governance structure, and creating positive, 21stcentury messaging about the benefits of federated giving.

Before his career in Jewish service, Jim served for five years as Assistant Secretary of the University for International Affairs at Yale University, where he coordinated university activities in Africa, the Middle East, and Europe and advised the Yale Corporation and the President's Council for International Activities.

Prior to his appointment at Yale, Jim spent ten years as a career diplomat in the Foreign Service of the United States Department of State. He served as Deputy Political

Counselor in Quito, Ecuador, as a member of the Secretary of State's Executive Secretariat, as Political-Military Affairs Officer in Sarajevo, Bosnia, and as Staff Assistant to the US Ambassador to Egypt.

Jim lives with his wife Lisa and their two children, Jonathan and Dahlia.

About our Honorees Mr. Ted Flaum

Ted Flaum has an extensive background with non-profit organizations with 30 years of furthering their missions. Ted is currently the Chief Executive Officer at the St. Paul Jewish Federation. He began his fundraising career at the Jewish Federation of Greater New Orleans after receiving his Masters degrees in Jewish Communal Service and Social Work from Hebrew Union College and University of Southern California, respectively. During his six years at the Jewish Federation, he held the positions of Director of Women's Division, Director of Community Relations Committee, and Director of Budget and Allocations.

In 1994, Ted moved to Nevada as the Campaign Director of the Jewish Federation of Las Vegas. In 1998 he was hired by United Way of Southern Nevada to lead its leadership and major gifts program.

In 2006, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southern Nevada hired him to transform its development program from transactional based fundraising to mission and value-based fundraising. Two years later, Boys Town Nevada recruited him to do likewise. While living in Nevada, Ted received a Certificate in Non-Profit Management from the University of Nevada - Las Vegas, earned his Certified Fundraising Executive designation

and was named Outstanding Fundraising Executive by the Las Vegas Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals.

In 2009, Ted relocated to St. Paul with his wife, Jackie, and two sons, Gabriel and Jacob to accept the position of Campaign Director for St. Paul Jewish Federation. In 2014, he was hired as the Chief Executive Officer at Jewish Family Service of St. Paul. One of his accomplishments that he is especially proud of was securing seed funding from the St. Paul Jewish Federation to start a chaplaincy program for the Twin Cities Jewish community. In 2019, the St. Paul Jewish Federation rehired him as its Chief Executive Officer.
